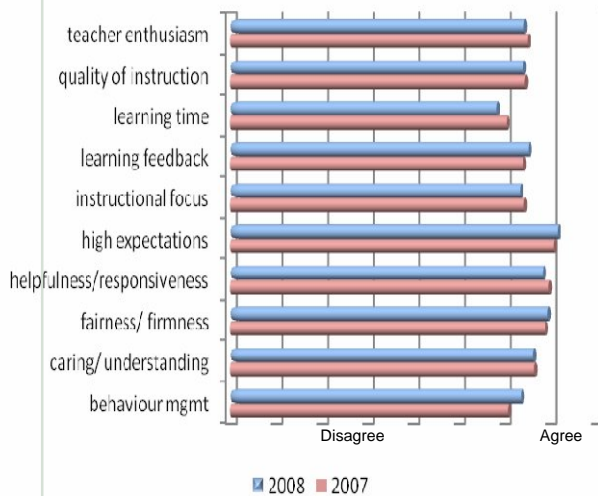


HOW DO OUR STUDENTS FEEL ABOUT THE QUALITY OF THEIR SCHOOL LIFE?

HISTORY

Hampton High School opened in 1992. It was built partly because the community of Hampton wanted its own high school and partly to alleviate overcrowding at Kennebecasis Valley High School where Hampton's high school students were attending. Students from the Kingston Peninsula who had attended Macdonald Consolidated School also transferred to Hampton High School. Our students, therefore, come from the Kingston Peninsula, Bloomfield, Hampton, Pas-sakeag, Lakeside, Smithtown, Titusville, Barnesville, Upham, Darlings Island and Nauwigewauk. The Hampton Theatre, an integral part of Hampton High School, was added after a major fund-raising campaign by the community.

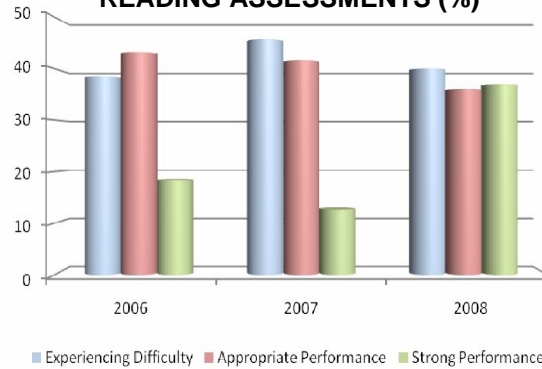

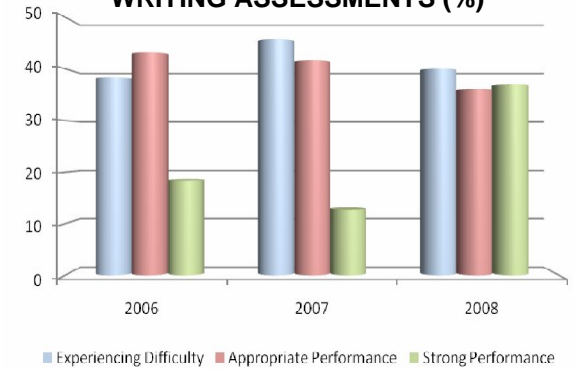
HAMPTON HIGH'S SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN 2007-2010

- Hampton High's relationship with its community (students, parents and local community) will be enhanced.

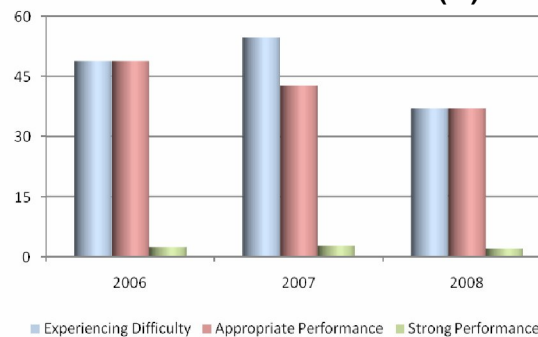
ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY READING ASSESSMENTS (%)



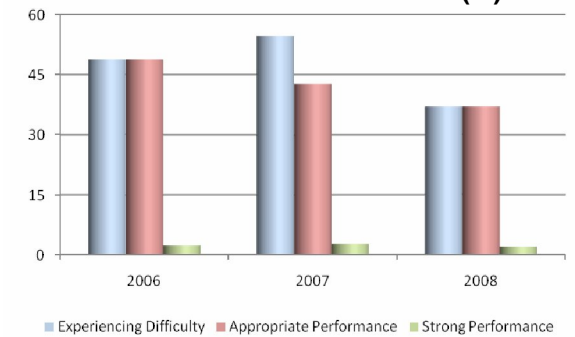
ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY WRITING ASSESSMENTS (%)
